INFORMATION AND PROMOTIONAL RESOURCES PREPARED TO ENHANCE EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES



In accordance with subparagraph 8.4.22 of the Action Plan for Implementation of the State Program for 2025–2030 on Combating Illicit Trafficking of Narcotic Drugs, Psychotropic Substances and Their Precursors and Drug Addiction, in 2026 the Permanent Working Group of the State Commission prepared new visual educational documents to strengthen anti-drug propaganda and awareness-raising efforts.

The visual materials cover the following topics: “Hidden drug risks in digital environment” (information about drug risks in digital space, hidden manipulation via the Internet and social networks, as well as dangers of content based on artificial intelligence technologies, strengthening digital literacy and personal safety skills); “For teenagers and young people” (raising awareness of the risks posed by drugs among young people, explaining psychological pressure and misconceptions, and developing independent decision-making skills and the ability to say “no”); “Recommendations for parents” (the nature of psychoactive substances, the serious harm they cause to mental and physical health, the mechanisms of addiction, risk factors for use, and the importance of timely detection of early behavioral and physiological signs in adolescents).

Distribution of these visual materials is planned as part of educational activities organized by the Standing Working Group of the State Commission, campaigns and training sessions conducted in a number of districts and cities, as well as during other comprehensive activities.

INFORMATIONAL MEETING HELD ON “THE ROLE OF FAMILY IN COMBATING DRUG ADDICTION”



On 16 January 2026, in accordance with subparagraph 8.4.7 of the Action Plan for Implementing the 2025–2030 State Programme to Combat Illicit Trafficking of Narcotic Drugs, Psychotropic Substances and Their Precursors and Drug Addiction, executive authorities of the Binagadi district and the Working Group of the State Commission for Combating Drug Addiction and Illicit Trafficking of Narcotic Drugs held an

educational meeting for parents at Secondary School No. 283 in Baku.

Main goal of the meeting was to increase the role of family in drug abuse prevention, strengthen parental responsibility, and raise awareness in this area.

POLICEMEN AND COMMUNITY LEADERS INTRODUCED STUDENTS TO THE WORLD OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AS PART OF THE STUDENT TROOPS CAMPAIGN IN PRIMORSKY KRAI



As part of the nationwide Student Troops campaign, officers from the Spassky Intermunicipal Department of the Russian Ministry of Internal Affairs, together with members of the Public Council, held an educational event for students.

Aim of the campaign – to introduce young people to the work of law enforcement agencies, to inform them about career opportunities within the Ministry of Internal Affairs, as well as to improve students’ legal literacy and strengthen trust between the police and the community.

In the assembly hall of the Spassky MO MVD of Russia students were greeted by representatives of structural divisions. They watched a video about

service in internal affairs agencies, after which they learned about the specific activities of the investigation departments, juvenile inspectors, drug control department, and forensic experts. Officers explained in detail specifics of each department’s work, showed how crimes are investigated and public order is maintained.

During the conversation participants were reminded of dangers of drugs, told about destructive consequences of using illegal substances, and informed about criminal liability for distribution.

They then went on to explain the most common types of fraud, citing real-life examples. They urged young people to be vigilant, gave advice on how to avoid becoming victims of crime, and reminded them of responsibility for illegal actions.

Students showed great interest in the work of law enforcement agencies. Topics such as cybersecurity and responsibility for drug crimes sparked particularly lively discussions.

Participants also honed their skills in disassembling and assembling weapons, learned how to use gas masks, and discovered intricacies of forensic experts’ work.

In conclusion, students were informed about opportunities for further employment and admission to higher education institutions within the Russian Ministry of Internal Affairs system, as well as about benefits and social guarantees provided to employees of internal affairs agencies.

A GROUP OF STUDENTS VISITED THE RUSSIAN MINISTRY OF INTERNAL AFFAIRS OFFICE FOR THE SIRIUS FEDERAL TERRITORY



For several years now, the Russian Ministry of Internal Affairs has been holding an annual All-Russian campaign called “Student Troops” to mark Russian Student Day. As part of this tradition, officers from the Russian Ministry of Internal Affairs Department in the Sirius Federal Territory invited students from Sirius University’s college, master’s and postgraduate programs to visit.

At the beginning of the meeting traffic police officers talked to children about road safety rules and importance of obeying traffic regulations, told about technical equipment used in their work, and introduced to nuances of their job. Much attention was paid to factors contributing to accidents

involving personal mobility devices.

Meeting with law enforcement representatives continued in the forensic department. Here, participants learned about the types of forensic investigations conducted by specialists in this field. Employees showed the young people the contents of special forensic kits used when visiting crime scenes. Participants were also given a unique opportunity to try their hand at being an expert by taking their own fingerprints.

Then, police officers gave a talk on the most common types of fraud and ways to protect against them. Special attention was paid to negative consequences of drug use, as well as legal consequences of illegal trafficking of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances.

At the end of the meeting, police officers answered questions that interested children.

PENZA POLICE OFFICERS TOLD STUDENTS ABOUT DANGERS OF DRUGS



Officers of the Drug Control Department of UMVD of Russia in the Penza Region organized a preventive meeting for students of the Penza Social and Pedagogical College. Main topic of discussion was prevention of crimes related to illegal drug trafficking.

In a live dialogue format Senior Investigator of UNK UMVD of Russia in the Penza Region Police Major Yulia Ermolaeva spoke in detail about penalties for the distribution, storage, sale, use, and even promotion of drugs. She did not hide terrible consequences of using illegal substances and warned students about various ways of getting involved in drug trafficking, especially

via the Internet, where criminals often disguise themselves as harmless offers.

At the end of the meeting, students were shown the documentary film “World behind the looking-glass” («Зазеркалье»). This film was created specifically to prevent teenagers and young people from becoming involved in illegal drug trafficking, vividly demonstrating all the horrors and consequences of this path.

**PROBLEMS AND SHORTCOMINGS IN THE SYSTEM FOR COMBATING DRUG CRIME ANALYZED**

Representatives of the Presidential Administration, the State Security Service, the Ministry of Internal Affairs, the Department for Combating Economic Crimes, the Customs Committee, and the Border Troops as well as first deputy heads of internal affairs agencies (more than 100 people) who participated online from studios in regions with serious crime situations and border cities and districts) held a meeting at the Agency.

The meeting provided a comprehensive discussion of current problems and shortcomings in organization of operational and investigative efforts in combating drug crime, staffing and technical resources, and

strengthening control in border areas.

Practical experience was analyzed and proposals were reviewed to improve efficiency and further refine preventive and operational-investigative measures.

Following the event, it was decided to develop draft regulatory documents to implement proposals made by participants.

The meeting addressed questions related to conducting a high-level and effective forum, and specific tasks were defined for organizational and practical measures.


This forum is scheduled for April 2026 in Samarkand

MEASURES TO COMBAT DRUG ADDICTION IN THE REGIONS DISCUSSED



A meeting was held in Kashkadarya with participation of senior Agency officials and members of the regional commission for drug and psychotropic substance control.

It discussed comprehensive measures being implemented in the regions to ensure compliance with Presidential Decree No. ПФ-207. In particular, it analyzed the effect of preventive work aimed at preventing drug addiction and drug crime, as well as educational and promotional activities carried out in educational institutions, mahallas, and

work collectives.

Reports were also heard from officials on the work being done to promote healthy lifestyles among young people and minors, as well as to foster an uncompromising attitude toward harmful habits.
